I SEMINARI DI STUDIO DELLA Scuola di Specializzazione in Psicologia della Salute

This presentation first provides results from a study on former Swiss child laborers. These were who were taken from their parents, often due to poverty or moral reasons (e.g. the mother being unmarried, very poor, of gypsy origin, etc.), and sent to live with farmers who needed cheap labour. The majority of these children, now adults, have been severely mistreated, suffered neglect and physical and sexual abuse. We studied 140 of them with regard to consequences of adversities and trauma, epigenetic findings and—in a sample of their 50 children—second-generation psychological effects.

Since the presenter is involved in the development of the new International Classification of Diseases ICD-11 (to appear in 2017), the new diagnoses and its clinical criteria will be presented. New diagnostic formulations exist for: Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), Complex PTSD—a condition often to detect after aversive or traumatic childhood experiences, sexual violence or long-term torture—and Prolonged Grief Disorder (PGD). PTSD, CPTSD and PGD will be presented by recent studies. Trauma-related disorders can be treated by various efficacious psychotherapies. Our group further developed and investigated the Life Review Treatment for PTSD, and several internet-based interventions for PTSD and PGD. To serve clients from other cultures, we modified conventional Euro-US intervention approaches for the needs of other cultures by changing parts of treatment rationales. I will present some of these treatment rationales in more detail.
